Chairman DuPont: We Will call this hearing to order. There are a number of bills that this committee will be hearing today that are listed in the bulletin and we will take them up in the order in which they are listed there. The first bill is an act to clarify the use of Wholesaler permits. (I think we already had testimony on that at our last public hearing. Is there anybody either for or against that bill? If not we will move on to an Act Concerning limitation of permits. Anyone who would like to speak in favor of that? Against? An Act Concerning Storage of Alcoholic Liquors. An Act concerning Appeals from decisions of the Liquor Control Commission. An Act Concerning Loitering on Liquor Permit Premises. Yes Sir, do you want to come forward please? Do you want to come up and speak into the microphone please? Would you identify yourself for the record if you please.

Oscar Canstein- Danbury, Connecticut: On this House Bill 5453, An Act Concerning Loitering On Liquor Permit Premises, we have a club in Danbury, The _____ Club, they have changed their permit from the Maint Street to a town park, I would like to know what they mean by loitering when they have people down at this park all day long. And this club premise is right on the town park or in the town park area. Now what will you consider loitering? Will it be people inside the building, on the building or anywhere near the premises? Now these will be young people out there. School children and under age children. Now how they got the permit in the first place I don't know, but they got the permit. I would like to know what this loitering section will cover.

Chairman DuPont: This is to loiter on his premises where such liquor is kept for sale. I would assume it would be inside the building. Does that answer your question sir: Is there anyone else who would like to testify in connection with An Act Concerning Loitering on Liquor Permit Premises? Either for or against? The next bill is 5387, actually it deals with the sale of alcoholic beverages on Christmas Day and we already have had a public hearing on that. Is there anyone else here today who would like to speak either for or against that bill please come forward. Yes sir.

Representative Sebastian Polo: 5th District, Hartford: I am in favor or 5387 and I hope that this committee would come out with a favorable report. Thank you.

William Hickey, The Connecticut Brewers and Wholesalers Board of Trade: These are the gentlemen that you obviously know at in charge of wholesaling Beer in the State of Connecticut. This bill is new to us I just saw it this morning. We did receive some word that a bill of this nature might be introduced. We feel that this is really not the appropriate time to do it. It is the type of thing, what it really does of course is increase the application fee both initially
