as to suggest anyone ill is violent. Mental illness is a variety of sicknesses which may or may not have anything to do with whether or not you are incapable of handling your own affairs.

The second assumption it makes is that the poor are incapable. That if you only have \$5,000, you are incapable of handling your own affairs. I thought we'd outgrown the concept that we have to be benevolent, paternalistic for the poor. If the state is so really concerned about protecting its funds, why doesn't it consider some type of lien applying to everybody, whether you have 29 million dollars, but why pick on someone who only has \$5,000 but by being legislatively determined incapable.

Now, we are really sorry that the proposed bill 951 which is the bill that was introduced to this committee, suddenly became 2110 and we were therefore asked that this committee reject Committee Bill 2110, that you give it an unfavorable committee report and moreover that the memories of this committee join in the Judiciary Committee in repealing the abominable 4-68G. Thank you very much.

SENATOR SAMUEL HELLIER: Thank you very much. Is there anybody else who would like to speak to Senate Bill #2110? I declare the hearing closed on 2110 and the next bill is Senate Bill 2192, AN ACT NAMING THE SECURITY TREATMENT CENTER THE WHITING FORENSIC INSTITUTE. If not we will declare the hearing closed on SB 2192 and that completes our agenda for the day and thank you very much for coming and I declare the hearing closed.
