THE SPEAKER:

Will you remark further on the Amendment? If not, the question is on its adoption. All those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed? The Amendment is adopted and ruled technical. Will you remark further on the Bill as amended? The gentleman from the 112th.

REP. HENDERSON (112th):

Yes Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, this Bill would outlaw the use, installation or sale of a device that would cause an odometer to register other than true mileage on a motor vehicle. An odometer is the mileage counter on the speedometer of an automobile. The devices are a mechanical reduction gear placed on the transmission of a motor vehicle and there is no use for this reduction gear, other than an attempt to cause lesser mileage to be recorded.

At present, automobiles constructed since 1971 have a tamper proof odometer which resists the turning back of mileage on an automobile. However, there is sold today, a mechanical reduction gear which when installed records less mileage, than the true mileage. This of course, is not in the interest of consumers in purchasing used automobiles. This is a good Bill and I urge its passage.
