Yes, this bill eliminates one of the reporting days in September and the thirtieth and the seventh days preceding an election. The bill reduces the number thereby and replaces it with a filing required on the second Tuesday in September. It is designed to simplify the process prior to the election, immediately prior to the election. It's a bill that is endorsed by the Elections Commission. It was felt that the filing dates under the old law were unnecessarily burdensome of candidates.
