I'd like to call Mr. Carroll, and Mr. Simmons and Mr. Walsh to come up here and aid me with some of the questions because there are a lot of bills here and we're going to comment on all thirty, so seeing they affect the Motor Vehicle Department, we did the best we could in the time frame that was presented. And I'm sure all of you have tried to live with that also.
