

many responses from the different parts of the community. I have gotten much favorable opinion on this bill. I've also gotten some what I would consider to be quite unfavorable opinion - in the method of threats upon myself and members of my family which I'm very willing to take if I can in any way stop this sense of hatred and bigotry that we see not only in Meridan, but we saw in Windom and Willimantic, that we saw in Scotland, Connecticut, that we saw throughout the State of Connecticut and, unfortunately, beginning again in the United States of America.

I do not in any way want to take away the rights of groups such as the Klan to their opinion as their constitutional right, it is not my intention to take their right away. It is my intention that if they want to exercise that right, then do it in the opinion, do it publicly. Don't hide behind a mask or a hood. If you believe strongly in your opinions, strong enough to risk arrest or whatever, then you have the right to state that opinion, do it in open, don't hide behind a mask or a hood because only cowards and outlaws hide behind hoods. I'd be happy to answer any questions that the committee might have.

They are, however, major technical revisions of these two titles, the first since 1958 revision of the general statutes. They clarify and they update the language of the statutes. They remove clearly obsolete sections and they consolidate sections of --

on similar topics. These two bills were presented -- two revisions were presented last year to the Judiciary Committee and received joint favorable report from this committee. Action was deferred, however, at the request of the Legislative Commissioner's Office so that further -- so that further study could be made by that office. This summer and this fall that study has been taken with the attorneys for that office and the attorneys of the Law Revision Commission and presented to you today are the updated and re-draft of those two bills.

The Judicial Department and the State's attorneys and the public defenders have also had input into these two revisions. The Commission respectfully requests that the Judiciary Committee give early consideration to these bills.

We've been informed by the Legislative Commissioner's Office that this is most important since bills of substance could later affect these bills and it's very important to have these two technical provisions passed early in this session. If there are any questions --
