Yes. This bill would prohibit a court from accepting a plea of guilty or nolo contendere from any

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defendant unless the court first advises him that a conviction may result in his deportation, exclusion from the United States or denial of naturalization. Under this bill, if the court fails to advise the defendant of the possible consequences of the conviction, the defendant shows that his plea and conviction could result in deportation. The court could, at a subsequent date, be required to vacate the judgment and permit the defendant to withdraw his plea and enter a plea of not guilty. There are a lot of other states that have adopted similar legislation with the influx of immigrants in the United States and the problems created by the two -misdemeanor rule and one-felony rule, alot of people are not aware of the consequences of these and face deportation and being able to do nothing about it.
