REP. JOHNSTON: (451st)

Mr. Speaker, and members of the House, at this time I'd like to place three items on the Consent Calendar and for action later today, and as a matter of explanation to the new members of the Chamber, I will move these items to consent. At any time any member may remove any one of them from the Calendar, and at the end of the day today we will take one voice vote on all of those items.

As we progress into two, three, four and five days a week, we will place items on the Consent Calendar on one day. They will be held over until the next day, and allowing people to read them through and still be able to remove them from the Calendar, and on that second day we will again voice all of those items.

So at this time, Mr. Speaker, I would like to move that the following items be placed on the Consent Calendar for action later today, starting on page 1, Calendar No. 41, House Bill 6248, File No. 30, Calendar No. 43, House Bill 6249, File No. 29, and on page 2, Calendar No. 46, House Bill 6999, File No. 37. I move that those items be placed on the Consent Calendar.

Mr. President; I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

SENATOR SCHNELLER:

Yes, Mr. President. This bill would apply to the joint committee on Legislative Management the same statutory requirements as are currently applied to the Executive Branch for the purchase of or contract for supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services and for the sale of personal property. These requirements include those for competitive bidding, providing notice record keeping and emergency purchases, and if there are no objections, Mr. President, I move it to the consent calendar.

Hearing no objections, so ordered.

THE CLERK:

Clerk has Calendar No. 74, House Bill No. 6999, File No. 37.
An Act Concerning An Office Of State Capitol Security. Favorable Report of the Committee on Legislative Management.

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THE CHAIR:

Senator Schneller.

SENATOR SCHNELLER:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR SCHNELLER:

Yes, Mr. President. This bill would place in the statutes the system which actually has been in use by the joint committee on Legislative Management for the security of Capitol building and grounds under its control, remove the statutory authority of the Speaker and President Pro Tem to each appoint his own security officers for his own chamber, create a new procedure for committee selection of the chief security officer, extend the prohibition to a certain security officers concerning the possession of a firearm or a billy club in the Capitol or other buildings used for legislative purposes, purposes rather, and make some other related changes, and, Mr. President, if there is no objection, I would move the bill to the consent calendar.

THE CHAIR:

Hearing no objection, so ordered.

THE CLERK:

Clerk has Calendar No. 75, House Bill No. 5167, File No. 26.
An Act Extending The Moratorium On New Gambling Facilities And Pari-

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ber 1, therefore leaving three months of limbo. The amendment merely makes the effective date of the statute coincide with the ending of our present problems. To clarify any other concerns, there are presently four OTB parlors that have recently been contracted for. That would not create a problem or contradiction with the passage of this bill. If there is no objection, Mr. President, I would move it to the consent calendar.

THE CHAIR:

Hearing no objection, so ordered.
