Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the bill.

Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. Ladies and gentlemen, this act clarifies and corrects several provisions of the State employees retirement system. Number one, the bill would correct the dollar amount of the allowance paid to the surviving spouse of State Police officers to \$325, which is presently an amount being paid.

In addition, it would include under the definition of State service service as an employee of a State-aided institution or as a vending stand operator working under the State Board of Education and Services for the Blind permit. It would also correct the normal retirement age for members of Tier 1 to 55. It would clarify the status of withdrawals of contributions and extend the right to purchase credits to members with prior service as a deputy sheriff or for another state.

It would also correct the mistake in Public Act 83-533 concerning the calculation of disability

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retirement benefits under Tier 2. I would urge its adoption, Mr. Speaker.

MS. MORAN: (continued)

We worked with the new actuaries this year and had the best data we have ever -- the commission has ever had, as far as I can tell. Even so, with a two-month preparation period the estimates need to be reworked. Now, we have asked the actuaries to return to clarify their estimates of cost and to take some other factors into consideration and we think we can have better data for you for the coming year. But, the proposal in this bill is absolutely impossible for us to live with and I would ask you to ignore this bill.
