Thank you, Mr. President. I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

SENATOR ATKIN:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. What this bill does, is make any individual or entity ineligible for contracts under programs set out of the bill to be looked at and audited by the Economic Development Commissioner of the Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities.

The present law does not allow a contractor under the small and minority business set aside program to contract with a business when its shares, ownership, management or employees. And this simply extends that prohibition to cover any relationship to where an individual or entity, directly or indirectly controls such a business. Additional, it requires the Commissioner of Economic Development to study racial or ethnic discrimination against minority contractors in

the awards of the state before and after 1982, when the first minority set aside program was first enacted.

Additionally, under FAC, \$50,000 has been appropriated to that Department. I would urge adoption of the bill.

Yes, Mr. Speaker, this bill proposes to do a few things. Section 1 of the bill adds definitions for affiliated control and person under the State set-aside legislation.

It also indicates that no person affiliated with another may be eligible for participation in the set-aside program if both affiliated persons considered together would not qualify as a small contractor or a minority business enterprise.

Section 2 provides for a study to be conducted under the supervision of the Department of Economic Development to determine whether specific instances of racial discrimination occurred both prior to and subsequent to 1988, which is the date of the establishment of the present set-aside program.

Section 3 provides for an appropriation of \$50,000 to fund the study that's described in Section 2.

In Section 4, it merely indicates that the bill is to be effective on July 1, 1990.

Once again, Mr. Speaker, I urge passage of the

bill.
