DEPUTY SPEAKER FRITZ:

Yes, thank you, Madam Speaker. This bill is relatively simple. The Connecticut General Statutes permits charitable organizations to conduct events throughout the year in which beer and wine is sold at those events.

Presently the law provides such charitable organizations can get a permit for four events in any given calendar year. What this bill provides is that we increase the number of events from four to eight.

It's a good fundraising mechanism for these charities, and as the need for monies continues to grow for the causes that are espoused and supported by these charities, I think it's important that the state

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do what it can to increase the availability and the manner by which these charities raise money.

So with that, it's a very slight change, just increasing the number from four to eight. I urge my colleagues to join me and support the bill. I move adoption. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

DEPUTY SPEAKER FRITZ:
