the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of
the bill in concurrence with the Senate, I believe.

REP. FOX (146th):

Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This bill comes to us
from our LCO staff to correct what appears to be an
omission in our general statutes in how we, the appeal
process from decisions of the Judicial Review Council.

Currently, judges, family support magistrates,
and workers' compensation commissioners who have a
complaint or an ethical violation alleged against them
will go to the Judicial Review Council.

If the Judicial Review Council finds probable cause an appeal can then be brought by judges and family support magistrates. That appeal mechanism by which the appellant can go to the Supreme Court does not now include workers' compensation commissioners.

It was the thought of LCO staff that is intended to be included and is merely an omission, and what this bill does is, it does include workers' compensation commissioners and puts them in the same position as judges as family support magistrates when appealing these decisions, and I urge passage of the bill.

DEPUTY SPEAKER ALTOBELLO:

Thank you, Representative Fox. Representative O'Neill of the 69th, you have the floor, sir.

REP. O'NEILL (69th):

Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would concur this is what appears to be an omission previously by the Legislature in terms of including the workers' compensation commissioners as having the same rights as judges and family support magistrates to appeal the probable cause findings to the court and I would urge passage of the bill.
