DEPUTY SPEAKER GODFREY:

REP. SHARKEY (88th):

Good evening, Mr. Speaker.

DEPUTY SPEAKER GODFREY:

Good evening, sir.

REP. SHARKEY (88th):

Mr. Speaker, I move acceptance of the joint  
committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

DEPUTY SPEAKER GODFREY:

The question is on passage.

REP. SHARKEY (88th):

Mr. Speaker, these are just technical changes to  
the Planning and Development's statutes throughout our  
general statutes. I urge my college to support it.

DEPUTY SPEAKER GODFREY:

Thank you, sir.

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The distinguished ranking member, Representative Aman.

REP. AMAN (14th):

DEPUTY SPEAKER GODFREY:

REP. TONG (147th):

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This amendment makes minor changes to our statutes to prevent blight. Under our current statutes a municipality may make an assessment on blighted property and use those funds to enforce our blight statutes. Under current law, you cannot use those funds to remediate the blight, such as to cut the grass or remove a fallen tree. This would change that and permit municipalities to make that change.

I want to thank Representative Floren for her

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work on this amendment. Thank you very much.
