DEPUTY SPEAKER ORANGE:

DEPUTY SPEAKER ORANGE:

Will the Clerk please call LCO Number 3165, designated as House Amendment Schedule "A."

THE CLERK:

LCO Number 3165, House "A," offered by Representative Fontana and Senator Crisco.

DEPUTY SPEAKER ORANGE:

The Representative seeks leave of the Chamber to summarize the amendment. Is there objection to summarization? Is there objection? Hearing none, Representative Fontana, please proceed, sir.

REP. FONTANA (87th):

Madam Speaker, this is a technical amendment to a technical bill. It simply removes Section 8 of the bill in its entirety and renumbers the remaining sections. It does so because after the bill was drafted, raised and voted out of committee, our LCO attorney determined that, in fact, this language did not need to be changed.

The language in capital letters contained within this section ought to remain and did not need to be removed and, in fact, should not be removed. I therefore urge adoption of the amendment.

DEPUTY SPEAKER ORANGE:
