### AN ACT CONCERNING THE REVISOR'S TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS TO THE GENERAL STATUTES

Judiciary Committee  
Public Hearing  
March 31, 2014

#### Purpose and source of bill:

The attorneys in the Legislative Commissioners' Office periodically identify and propose technical changes to the general statutes concerning grammar, clarity, accuracy of internal references and consistency in the general statutes. Senate Bill 493 includes such proposed changes. The general statutes and the Joint Rules of the Senate and House of Representatives both reference the legislative commissioners' revisor's bill (C.G.S. Sec. 2-30b(b) and J.R. 9(h)(4)).

#### Effect of conflict with another bill enacted in the 2014 regular session:

Section 2-30b(b) of the general statutes provides that "[i]n the case of an irreconcilable conflict between an act... and an amendment in the legislative commissioners' revisor's bill...the conflicting provision in the legislative commissioners' revisor's bill shall not be effective."
