History

Despite an evident concern from very early colonial days and the General Assembly's inclusion of strong provision in the Code of 1650, education lacked real supervision by the state until 1838. School districts, as part of or coterminous with ecclesiastical districts, usually managed colonial schools and had power to levy taxes. In 1795 and 1798, the state created the School Fund with the proceeds from the sale of its western lands. The state divided the interest on those proceeds among "school societies" organized to manage local schools, often called common schools. In 1837, the federal government divided a surplus in the United States Treasury among the states. Connecticut apportioned its share to the towns as a Town Deposit Fund, with half the interest income for educational use. After 1859, all the interest went towards educational uses.

In the 1820s and 1830s, many influential citizens became dissatisfied with the results obtained from the funds' expenditure. In May 1838, the General Assembly passed a bill submitted by Henry Barnard providing for some state supervision. The state created a Board of Education, with Barnard as secretary, to investigate and report of the condition of all common schools. Four years later, in an economy move, the legislature repealed the act but replaced it in 1845 with a superintendent of public schools.

As early as 1823, reformers, including Rev. Thomas H. Gallaudet urged formal training of teachers as a means to improve the common schools. After almost a quarter-century effort by reformers, many of Connecticut's neighbors had created training academies or normal schools for teachers. In 1849, Connecticut established its State Normal School in New Britain. Henry Barnard became its principal as well as superintendent of common schools. The present Board of Education dates from 1865.

In 1953, P.A. 403 transferred some duties from the Connecticut Public School Building Commission to the State Board of Education.

A commissioner, who also served as secretary of the State Board of Education, heads the Department of Education. The department operates in junction with other closely related boards and agencies, including the Commission for Higher Education, the Board of Trustees for State Universities, the Board of Trustees of Regional Community Colleges, and the Board of Trustees of State Technical Colleges.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of various reporting documentation dating from 1845 to 1979. Included are report from state investigative agents and their supervisors reports, the Superintendent of Common Schools, oversight committees, individual schools, the county temporary home, trade schools, vocational schools, technical schools and adult education. There are also reports concerning child labor, school building inspections, finances, the school libraries, statistics, and other related subjects concerning the operation of schools in Connecticut. There are also various records, from the early part of this century, provided as proof of age for student's attending school in a district as well as for proof of age to obtain a work permit.

The majority dating from 1870 to 1930, come from foreign born individuals.

The collection also contains minutes from many organizations in or associated with the Department of Education including the Board of Education, the principals of state normal schools, the Secretary and Agents, the Connecticut Public School Building Commission, the Board of Trustees of the Mystic Oral School, and others. There are also some small series of publications, student awards, and photographs as well as documentation concerning the Connecticut Plan regarding education and training for World War II veterans.
