LEGISLATORS, 1927-1984

Introduction

In 1927 State Representative Julia Emery of Stamford formed the Connecticut Organization of Women Legislators (OWL), the first in the nation. The objectives of OWL were to "kindle and promote the spirit of friendliness among past, present and future women" of the Connecticut state legislature and "discuss and study legislation." OWL by-laws stipulated that meetings were to be held biennially in Hartford on the first Tuesday in March during sessions of the General Assembly. In April 1938, Ms. Emery and the Connecticut OWL successfully led a national movement to form a National Organization of Women Legislators to serve as a support group and interstate network, political activist group encouraging the election and appointment of women to government posts, and an informational clearinghouse. Today the Connecticut OWL serves not only as a support group but also promotes a legislative agenda for consideration by the General Assembly.

The records of the Connecticut OWL were donated by the current OWL President, Representative Dorothy Osler and Representative Alice Meyer. The scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings and other information about past members, memorabilia and clippings regarding OWL tea party receptions and other social activities, group photographs, and often candid remarks about male and female members of the General Assembly.

Care should be exercised in examining the earlier scrapbooks on account of their deteriorating condition.
