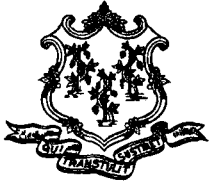

### SUMMARY INVENTORY NOW AVAILABLE OF PROMINENT CONNECTICUT ARCHITECT'S WORK

Connecticut State Librarian Clarence R. Walters announced today that a summary inventory to the Frank J. Forster Collection of Architectural Drawings (Record Group 69:73) is now available in the State Library's Archives, History and Genealogy Unit. The State Library is located at 231 Capitol Avenue, Hartford.

Forster (1886-1948), an important American architect during the first half of this century, achieved fame for designs on a number of New York City slum-clearance projects. He was also the architect for the Harlem Houses project. An award winning architect in the 1920's and 1930's, he published his first book in 1931, Country Houses: The Work of Frank J. Forster. He died at his home in Deep River, Connecticut. In 1974 his widow donated the collection of his drawings, sketches and photographs to the Connecticut State Library.

The collection, which consists of 193 folders, has material dating from 1911 to 1946 with a summary inventory of each folder and an alphabetical client index. The summary inventory and index were prepared and compiled by Alan Haines of Hartford, a retired design engineer who worked for Pratt & Whitney Aircraft for many years. Haines has been working in the State Library's Archives as a volunteer.

According to State Archivist, Mark Jones, a description of the contents of the 193 folders was not previously available, making use of them difficult. The index and inventory will now allow researchers to select specific folders for examination.

Researchers should contact the Archives, History & Genealogy Unit, a part of the State Library's Division of Readers Services at 566-3692 to receive information regarding application procedures and user regulations. When calling about the Forster collection, persons should refer to RG 69:73.
